

Don Huffines is a proud fifth-generation Texan, husband, father of five, grandfather of ten, and a successful self-made businessman. Born and raised in Dallas alongside his three brothers, Don learned the value of hard work early while greasing cars for \$2 an hour at his family's automotive business, Huffines Motor Company. After earning a B.B.A. in Finance from the University of Texas, he and his twin brother Phillip co-founded Huffines Communities in 1985. Today, their firm is one of the largest real estate developers in the Dallas–Fort Worth area, helping thousands of Texans achieve the American Dream of homeownership.

A strong Christian and lifelong conservative, Don brought his private-sector mindset to public service when he was elected to represent Dallas County's District 16 in the Texas Senate. He quickly earned a reputation as one of Texas' most conservative lawmakers, serving as Vice-Chair of the Senate Border Security, Veteran Affairs, and Transportation committees. Don consistently championed Republican Party of Texas legislative priorities, including term limits, pro-life protections, school choice, and filing the first constitutional carry bill in Texas Senate history.

Unlike any other elected official in Texas history, Don refused to accept a salary, pension, or perks — even paying for his own office furniture — because, as he often said, *"I work for the people, not the government."*

Don's tenure is best remembered for his fearless fight against corruption. He uncovered the largest government corruption scandal in modern Texas history, a \$100 million agency stealing millions in taxpayer funds. Despite \$1.3 million in lobbyist pressure to block his investigation, Don persisted. His work resulted in six officials going to prison and the agency being shut down overnight — saving Texans tens of millions of dollars.

For his record, Don earned a 99% rating from Texans for Fiscal Responsibility, a 100% pro-life score from Texas Right to Life, and an A+ rating from Gun Owners of America.

After leaving the Senate, Don founded the Huffines Liberty Foundation, a research institute advancing liberty, prosperity, and virtue in Texas. The Foundation produces policy research, holds lawmakers accountable, and promotes conservative solutions for lowering property taxes, reducing regulations, and strengthening protections against government overreach.

Don has remained a generous philanthropist and a leading conservative activist. He supports causes such as Dallas-area pregnancy centers and wildlife conservation groups, has raised over \$1.5 million for President Donald Trump's campaigns, and contributed millions to support liberty-minded Republicans across the country.

Don and his wife of 37 years, Mary Catherine, have five children — Colin, Devin, Terence, Deirdre, and Russell — and are now the proud grandparents of ten. A passionate historian, Don maintains one of the most extensive private Texas history collections, now displayed at the Alamo. He is also an avid outdoorsman, hunter, and devoted family man.
